This month we explore the theme of pluralism. Our faith is informed by wisdom of many traditions, and historically Unitarians and Universalists were curious and interested in learning about and from different teachings.

On January 7th I'll be preaching "Do Good Fences Make Good Neighbors?" I've often used the image of the porcupine problem in my sermons, where we both need proximity to one another but our natural prickly natures can harm each other leading to alienation. Robert Frost challenged the notion that good fences make good neighbors with his famous poem "mending walls" but healthy boundaries are necessary for healthy relationships. We will explore both human inclinations of walls and universality.

On January 14th I'll be preaching "King in India." When Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. went to India for the first time to learn more about Ghandi and his uses of nonviolent resistance he was met with a greeting welcoming him as the leader of the American harijan. He bristled at the notion but it later informed him significantly in his approach to social change. We will look at the ways King learned from Ghandi and from India, and the ways our country was an influence and influenced by such social change.

On January 28th we have a guest. My spouse, Dr. Lynn Cooper, is coming close to finishing her first draft of her book on interfaith friendship that has arisen from her doctoral studies and her work with the Tufts University Chaplaincy, including its interfaith "Befriend" program. With a world full of division, making genuine friendship across traditions helps us against isolation and ignorance.
